


## MHS/PHMS Traffic Changes

The morning and afternoon traffic patterns around MHS, PHMS and Northwood will have a new look this fall. Work has begun to add two parking lots on the east and southeast sides of the MHS campus. The new parking lots will provide more than 270 new parking spaces. In addition, the project includes two more areas for traffic to enter and exit the campus.

PHMS parents picking students up will have one of the biggest changes, as they will enter PHMS from the far west entrance. The loop between MHS and PHMS will be closed to all traffic for construction of the new wellness facility which will begin later this year.

Any personal items being dropped off (school boxes, etc.) must be labeled with the student's name.

Kindergarten Welcome to School 6:00-7:00p.m. Parents and students must wear masks and will be escorted into schools in small groups for a short tour and welcome. One parent will be allowed in per student.

Any personal items being dropped off (school boxes, etc.) must be labeled with the student's name.

#### Preschool Thursday, August 6th

Waverly Elementary School 6:00-7:00p.m. - Parents and students must wear masks and will be escorted into schools in small groups for a short tour and welcome.

## Getting Ready for Back to School

Most importantly, each day and in every possible way, our staff members are working to keep our schools the engaging educational places you've come to expect while we maintain the important health and safety standards this year brings forth.

Our school board, administrators, and staff remain committed to opening our schools this Wednesday, Aug. 5. Our administrators worked diligently to create the Pioneer Pathways to Reopening with input from parents, teachers, school nurses, and support staff members. These plans were reviewed and approved by the Morgan County Health Department. Last week our board met with administrators from all school buildings and all departments to review plans for the school year and all of our Return to Learn plans.

We are constantly reviewing Morgan County data regarding COVID-19 and see that the number of positive cases has remained consistently low (an average of 2-4 new cases per day) for the last two months. Morgan County data is also more than 20 times below the state's hotspot of Marion County and

about four times below surrounding Johnson and Hendricks Counties. We also reviewed Governor Holcomb's Executive Orders 20-37 and 20-39 as well as updated information from the Indiana State Department of Health. We believe the plans and procedures in the Pioneer Pathways to Reopening meet all of the updated requirements as well as all existing ISDH and CDC requirements.

We continue to receive feedback from our families, and staff. We carefully read every message and thank you for sharing your perspective. We appreciate having an engaged community whose first priority is the health and safety of our staff and children.

I have the utmost confidence in our administration and staff to implement these plans and do everything in our power to keep our students and staff safe. We commit to you that we will continue to review the data and our operations regularly as the school year begins.

As we do every year, we will strive to #BeMoore under the unusual circumstances 2020 has brought us.



### **News Briefs**

Attendance Reminders - Unlike in the spring, the Indiana Department of Education requires 180 days of school attendance. eLearning students and in-class students are all required to be in attendance (online or in person) every school day.

For attendance purposes, eLearning students must log into their classes each day. MHS and PHMS students must log into each class period on time each day. Elementary students should log in at 9:00a.m. each day. Parents whose eLearning students are sick should call the school to report an absence (elementary eLearning families should call North Madison). Please see p. 6 for more absence information.

New Vaccination Requirement for All K-12 Students - Indiana's immunization requirements for 2020-21 include a new requirement for ALL students to have 2 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine. Per the IDOE, our vaccination deadline is September 2. Students may be excluded from school after that if they don't have proper documentation.
